She's written policy briefs; mediated staff, parents, and administrators, she's been a Crisis Prevention Institute Instructor, conducted alternative assessments for children who could not test in a regular setting, participated in restorative justice circles and more.

Magdalena Soña Alaniz Saiz is a licensed clinical social worker (LCSW) and holds a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership and Administration. She has over 20 years of experience with school systems as an educator, social worker, and administrator across elementary, middle school, high school, and higher education. Currently Dr. Saiz serves students and families as the Behavioral Health Coordinator of the New Mexico Public Education Department. In this role Dr. Saiz supports social and emotional learning (SEL) strategies, suicide prevention, and bullying prevention in schools, postvention supports for safe schools, and serves as the liaison between agencies and School-Based Health Centers to increase access to behavioral health services for students. She also supports school district administrators, school personnel, and outside agencies through training and technical assistance on SEL, suicide and bullying prevention.
